## Post Graduation Outcomes


In the 2023 Annual Report, 644 current and graduating College and Undergraduate Transfer Scholars told us about their college experiences. This brief focuses on graduating Scholars' career preparations and post-graduation plans, with 98% of graduating College and Transfer Scholars (n = 135) reporting on their next steps.

# Graduating Scholars' Plans for After College

47%	Work Full Time

The majority (87%) of graduating Scholars not yet enrolled in graduate school had plans to attend within three years after gaining work experience and pursuing opportunities.

At the time of graduation, 64 Scholars reported plans to work full-time. Those who had accepted positions were most likely to be working in STEM (27%), business or management (25%), education (25%), or health (11%).
